The removal of the flooring in the parish hall (which contained asbestos) began Monday, January 21<sup>st</sup>. The buildings are scheduled to be torn down beginning Monday, January 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Groundbreaking for the new building is planned for Sunday, February 3, 2019 at 9:45 am.** Please watch for more details.

## Stewardship Thoughts

**Hope, a Foundation for Duty and Delight**

*"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into his grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us."* Romans 5:1-5

*"For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience."* Romans 8:24-25

*"... in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect..."* 1 Peter 3:15

*"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."* Romans 15:13

God delights in those who hope in the Lord. Hope grows toward certainty as we grow in grace. Our hope in Christ results in our obedience, and obedience is a choice. Our hearts often lag behind but as we become more obedient to Christ, our heart catches up. When mind and heart are integrated, we are fully giving ourselves to the Lord – not out of “have to” but because of a “want to.”

That ties into our giving as well. Giving becomes a “want to” instead of a “have to.” When we start giving, it may be something of a sense of obligation, but as we grow in our giving it transcends mere duty to become duty and delight.

Our capacity to love and give of ourselves in the present is based upon the hope we have regarding our future. Faith, when genuine, produces hope. Our faith in Christ gives us hope in a future. Our faith in Christ gives us hope that we are forgiven. And thus, my future is secure. So what is there to worry about? We have enough. And if we have more than enough, we have still more to give away.

Christian hope is not based on feelings and it’s not wishful thinking – such as “I hope this or that will happen.” It is a confident expectation in the promises of God. It is a living hope (1 Peter 3:3). In the death and resurrection of Jesus, we have an eternal destiny. It is the hope we have regarding our eternal destiny that frees us to love in the present. And genuine love does not hold back. It lacks nothing. It fears nothing, and thus is free to give. When we have hope, we know we have not only a future, but a promise that Christ will come again. We no longer have to live in scarcity but in the joy of abundance. No longer do we live for ourselves. No longer do we have to be selfish with our time, talents, treasure, and testimony. For our hope is based on God’s inexhaustible grace toward us in the promise of salvation.

**“Thank you” doesn’t seem strong enough** to express gratitude for the generosity of our congregation. The results of our “*Stewards of God’s Influence*” Promise Sunday were gratifying, to say the least. If you have not had a chance to turn in your Promise cards or Time & Talent sheets, we urge you to do so as soon as possible. These help us plan for the new year. We also thank you for your part in our congregation’s ministry. Bless you for all you do for our church, not only in terms of giving, but for sharing your time, your talents and service to our Lord’s work. May God richly bless you for all you do. The La Vernia Veterans Memorial is a project of the La Vernia Historical Association. It is located in the La Vernia City Park. The ten walls of the memorial are engraved with the names of veterans who have honorably served in the US Military. Each inscription requires proof of honorable discharge and \$150, which is our cost.

The La Vernia Historical Association has a photo of 12 World War I soldiers of Evangelical Lutheran Emmanuel Church who returned" (there are 13 names mentioned in the caption). It was originally published in the "100 Year on The Cibolo" book.

We would like to see these local veterans honored with individual inscriptions on the wall. We do not know if these men have living family members. They are:

Donations of \$150 or more may be earmarked for a specific veteran and must be accompanied by an application, which can be obtained from us or the church office. Donations under \$150 will be added to the **ILC WWI Veterans Inscription Fund**. Inscriptions will be ordered when the goal is reached and all 13 Veterans listed can be inscribed at the same time.
