Serving in the Community:

Worship At Country Care Manor

We will meet at Country Care Manor on **Thursday, April 11th at 10:00 am** to bring worship and Holy Communion to the residents. Anyone is welcome to come and join us.

La Vernia Food Pantry

Help us collect the following items as Immanuel's contribution to the food needs at the pantry: **any kind of pasta, tomato sauce, canned meats**. Any non-perishable food items are welcome, but each church in the Ministerial Alliance is charged with collecting certain items.

40 Cans for 40 Days

We will participate again this year with the 40 Cans for 40 Days food drive for the La Vernia Food Pantry, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus at St. Ann's Catholic Church. The goal is for every member to bring 1 non-perishable food item for each of the 40 days of Lent.

We will collect these in the basket located in the narthex and there will also be a basket in the parsonage.

Personal Care Kits & Blessing Bag Items

We will also collect items for Personal Care kits and Blessing bags during Lent. This is a Sunday school service project, but members can participate also. Bring items and place them in the box in the annex classrooms or in the parsonage. You can bring items through Palm Sunday, April 14th. On that date, we will put kits and blessing bags together.

NALC Disaster Response

Our Texas Mission Region of the NALC is being asked to help with the recent disaster in Nebraska. There is an NALC church in Dannebrog that has flooded, along with over 100 families of that congregation. NALC Disaster Response has asked the Texas Mission District to send all supplies from our Disaster Warehouse in Rosenberg (and anything else we can gather) and send it to this disaster. We then will need to re-supply our warehouse.

Items needed: shovels, rakes, straw brooms, string mops, rubber gloves, leather gloves, face masks (N95 rating), paper towels, contractor trash bags, rags, scrub brushes, 5 gal buckets with lids, quilts, Bibles, travel size shampoos, lotions, toothpaste, deodorants, combs, toothbrushes, bath towels, gift cards to Home Depot, Lowe's, Walmart.

Bring these items to the church and leave them in the annex or parsonage. We will see that they get to the warehouse.

Lenten Series & Schedule

“Behold the Man!” was Pontius Pilate’s proclamation about Jesus as he stood trial for his life. Our Lenten journey this year will explore this proclamation. “Behold the man,” God in human flesh, Jesus. His incarnation will provide the basis for our meditation and proclamation on His Passion.

This Lent, we will consider what it means that God became man. In preparation for the celebration of a real, bodily, flesh-and-blood, bone-and-sinew resurrection, the resurrection without which our faith and or preaching are all in vain, consider the body of Jesus that exists in order to be nailed to a cross. The spiritual, bodiless Son of God became the embodied, enfleshed, incarnate Son of Mary. In Jesus, God has human flesh, a body, just like you. What could be more profound? Each week we’ll consider a different aspect of the body of Jesus Christ. What does it mean that, in Jesus, God has hands, feet, lungs, lips, eyes, and ears?

Stewardship Thoughts

What Is the Difference Between the Christian Tithes, Offerings, and Alms?

Giving is an important aspect of the Christian life. Money represents both your life and where your heart is. If you earn 10 dollars an hour, then a 10 dollar bill represents one hour of your life. When you give that same 10 dollars to God, you have, in fact, given God 1 hour of your life. This is why giving for the Christian is so important. In addition, where you put your money, your heart follows. So, if you invest in the things of God, your heart will be in the things of God. God knows this. Luke 12:34 – *“For where you treasure is, there will your heart be also.”* Because of this, there are three types of monetary giving that the Bible speaks of. They are: tithes, offerings, and alms. Here are the distinctions:

TITHES – Tithing is literally a tenth. Malachi 3:8 speaks of robbing God by withholding your tithes. God asks for 10% of your increase. This 10% was meant to fund the work of God (Numbers 18:24). It is given by the Christian as something that already belongs to God. Leviticus 27:30, 32 – *“And all the tithe of the land, whether of the seed of the land, or of the fruit of the tree, is the Lord’s: it is holy unto the Lord. And concerning the tithe of the herd, or of the flock, even of whatsoever passeth under the rod, the tenth shall be holy unto the Lord.”* Giving less than 10% is not tithing. Giving more than 10% is more than a tithe; only the 10% can be considered a tithe.

OFFERINGS – Offerings are exactly what it implies. There is no set amount to make it an offering. It is anything over the 10% that God requires that you decide to give because of your love for God and your thankfulness for what He has done for you. Deuteronomy 16:10 – *“And thou shalt keep the feast of weeks unto the Lord thy God with a tribute of a freewill offering of thine hand, which thou shalt give unto the Lord thy God, according as the Lord thy God hath blessed thee.”* An offering is something you decide. The amount is not set. It is given according to the blessings you believe God has blessed you with. This offering is given to the work of God as well. It is a way you say, “Thank you!”

ALMS – Alms are monetary, or things you have purchased, that you give to someone in need. It is your decision to help the poor, to meet the needs of the needy, and to love your neighbor. Acts 3:2 – *“And a certain man lame from his mother’s womb was carried, whom they laid daily at the gate of the temple which is called Beautiful, to ask alms of them that entered into the temple.”* This, again, is something you determine to do. There is no set amount, no determining factor except your own heart. Proverbs 19:17 – *“He that hath pity upon the poor lendeth unto the Lord; and that which he hath given will he pay him again.”*

A Note from the Treasurer

Immanuel members, I invite you to prayerfully reflect on some financial issues that present ongoing challenges for us.

Our approved budget for 2019 is \$230,102.00. This includes predicted expenditures for worship and service, congregational life, benevolence, building and grounds, administration, and salaries and benefits. It does not include expenses from dedicated accounts. The basic offering income required to meet our budgeted expenses is \$19,167 per month. The average monthly basic offering for January and February was \$17,258.

We should not ignore financial challenges, but neither should we wring our hands and despair of our future. Remember that Jesus and his movement were small and poor by worldly standards, but the Jesus Movement inaugurated God’s future for the world. We appreciate your sacrificial gifts towards our church ministries. Trust God, Immanuel Lutheran Church, and do the ministry which God has entrusted to us.

From Your Church Council . . .

Galatians 6:10 – *“Therefore, whenever we have opportunity, we should do good to everyone, especially to those in the family of faith.”*

In Galatians, Paul proclaims the reality that Christians are saved by faith and free in Christ; free to love and serve one another. The Church is a family born in Christ, as everyone is born into a natural family. We should have the same regard and commitment and love for our church family as we do for our natural family. Paul challenged the Galatians and he challenges us to keep nurturing the church and our family, and to trust God for the results. This leads to the broad question: How are we caring for each other? Here are concrete examples of ways we can care for members of our church family:

Pray for them. This is the most important aspect of our care for each other.

Write to them. This is relatively painless and means a lot to people. Whether it is a handwritten note, an email, or even a short text message, simply letting them know that you are thinking about them or missed them at church means more than we can often imagine.

Call them. It takes very little time and is welcomed by most. A brief phone call reminding them about an event or an opportunity to serve shows that their involvement matters to you.

Help them. If you know that there is a need, volunteer to help. Even if you are not able to do too much, every little bit helps and will mean a lot to them. If the need is great, contact the pastor or church office to help mobilize a team of helpers. Our church is committed to helping and taking care of our church family and community.

Paul reminds us that we should commit ourselves to Jesus, our church, and our church family. If we care for others, our church will grow in unity in Christ.
