Weaving a Church

The summer of 2005's ILC Newsletter featured an article by Mary Van Duzer describing the similarities and differences between weaving and creating a new church. I'm going to take some excerpts and make a comparison to our constructing our new building.

"When weaving, you don't 'whip out' a project in a few hours. Everything must be planned before a single strand of yarn is woven." It has taken long hours of planning for our new building to arrive at the shell we have today. We now need to pull together as a congregation and keep planning - each member sharing his or her own vision of how God's work will continue in this new building - just like it would be to determine the size, color, and design in weaving.

She writes: *"so, too, a new church needs careful planning as well as prayerful desire in advance."* Each envisioning appeal should be lifted up to God so that our unified project can be completed. Every person's wish is important, *essential to create a strong church.* We must ALL be part of the planning process; it cannot be done alone. All the strands of yarn contribute to the whole and not even one can be left out. Your vision, your opinion does make a difference. Let it be heard; talk to each other and/or talk to a council member.

"Building a new church is not about a building or programs. It is about relationships." If we want to keep the relationships we have built through the years and don't want them severed, we need to keep the lines of communication open. Also, we should be looking forward to the opportunity to use our new building to build new relationships with those who may not know the love of Christ. That's what ILC's ministry is all about. So, NOW is the time to voice your ideas as Phase II, which includes the interior classrooms, kitchen, fellowship area, offices and so on, is in its planning stages. NOW is the time to ask yourself how you can help or support the construction process, financially or otherwise, in order to accomplish this undertaking successfully.

To end with Van Duzer's words, *"There is one way in which weaving is not like our church. I can plan, set up and weave the project by myself, but this church can't happen without each person playing a role in it... It takes each and every one of us to be involved. Don't assume someone else will show up to help with a task or a gift...Everyone is needed! ...Your help, your prayers, your encouragement are a tremendous source of strength!"* Keep those coming. Take part in the building of OUR new building. Use your time and talents. Be that one strand of yarn that holds this mission together and brings it to fruition.


New Building Update . . .

Thank You for Growing Our Ministry by Your Generosity



In the days of Moses, God laid out an offering model that involved giving Him the choicest of options. He did not ask for the sheep that was sickly, the runt of the litter, or the animal that would place 2nd in a livestock competition. He asked for the FIRST and FINEST of what the people had to offer.

Benevolence offerings support the national NALC church and other outreach programs as designated by the Congregation Council.

Property Maintenance offerings are used for building maintenance, repairs, and property upkeep.

New Building offerings go to our new building project – the new parish hall, offices, and classrooms.

Other offerings to a specific ministry that you may designate; i.e., altar linens and candles, camp scholarships, cemetery, day camp, good Samaritan, Men of Immanuel, multi-media, music, organ, nursery/playground, Women of Faith, Youth Groups (Sr. High, Peacemakers, Confirmation, and Children of God). If you would like to give to one of these ministries, simply make a note on your offering envelope below "OTHER" and put the amount in that space.

The "Other" space is not a "total" space – there is no need to do a "total" on your envelope.

What we give to God is always more than just our money or our finances. It demands our whole selves - our whole beings and everything that we do and say. There are many ways in which we can give of our money, time and energy to God.
