A friend of mine recently challenged me to an exercise in giving thanks for the blessings and the grace that God showers upon me each and every day. I was challenged to intentionally give thanks each day for three (3) ways that God's grace touched my life. It can be BIG things – like major happenings and blessings that are life-changing. Your Lenten Offerings – Update

Through our weekly Lenten offerings, we collected \$2,928.00.

As was decided by the Congregation Council, this year's Lenten offerings went to the Children's Alliance of South Texas. This organization provides services to children and their non-offending caregivers who have endured physical abuse, witnessing of a crime, exploitation through the internet, child pornography, risk of abuse and/or neglect or human trafficking. They work together with law enforcement, district and county attorney's offices, social workers, advocates, medical and mental health professionals and others to provide high-quality, specialized services for abused children and their families. This child advocacy center plays a unique role in providing comprehensive, coordinated and compassionate services to child victims of abuse.

Update on Worship & Other Activities at Immanuel

The Congregation Council met on June 9, 2020 and decided to continue with worship in our sanctuary AND open up our buildings for other activities, at each group's discretion.

Worship services will continue at 8:00 and 10:30 am, with live streaming from the 10:30 service. **Reservations will no longer be required.** We will continue to follow the guidelines previously set forth by the Council. We will continue social distancing in our seating, filling the sanctuary from front to back and dismissing from back to front.

If you are not feeling well, have any conditions that may compromise your health, or feel there is a chance you have been exposed to Covid-19, please remain home and worship with us online.

These protocols will be followed for worship in the sanctuary:

- **Social distancing is required;** families may sit together, but please follow the 6 ft rule. If you feel the need for more separation, the annex may be used for seating.
- **You will be seated as you arrive – from the front of the sanctuary to the back;** dismissal will be done from the back to the front. **Enter through the front double doors only.**
- **Holy Communion will not be offered at this time.**
- Masks and gloves are encouraged, but not mandatory.
- Please sanitize your hands as you enter the building. Sanitizer will be made available.
- The Cry Room will be closed during this time to minimize cleaning requirements.
- All items – hymnals, prayer request cards, envelopes, attendance pads, etc – will be removed from the pews to minimize cleaning. Please call or email during the week to give your prayer requests. There will be no bulletins handed out – the announcements and service will be viewed from the projection screens.
- Offerings will be placed in a designated area.
- Minimize social gathering before and after the services.
- The sanctuary and restrooms will be sanitized between services.

If you have questions or comments on these protocols, please contact a member of the Congregation Council.

VERY IMPORTANT – please turn off your camera and mute your mic once signing in to the meeting. If you don't, everyone on the meeting can see you and hear you.

Remember those who may not received emails or have computer access. Give them a call and bring them up to date and/or help them worship remotely via phone.

The minutes from the May 19, 2020 meeting were approved. Treasurer's Report:

Discussion/Consent Items:

- Pastoral acts: funeral for Kirk McBride on May 27, 2020. Still waiting to set dates for confirmation, graduate recognition, church picnic.
- Mark installed plexiglass by organ as requested by Adrienne.
- Financial report: questions on pastor's mileage/IRS allowance and insurance; Chrystal to present more information on these items at the July council meeting. Treasurer's Report on page 9.

Next Meeting: Tuesday, July 14, 2020 at 7:00 pm. Depending on need for social distancing, the meeting will take place either in the sanctuary or parsonage.
