From The Pastor:

I want to share some thoughts and reflections with you this month. They are things that have been running through my mind and in my heart as I make ready to retire. My hope is that these ramblings would strike a chord in your own heart and mind and that the transforming power of the Holy Spirit might be at work.

We – at Immanuel Lutheran – are the Body of Christ. We became the Body of Christ in 1901 when Immanuel was formed as a congregation. Along the way, we've been faithful to the Gospel and have shared the Good News of Jesus Christ. During the one hundred and nineteen years of our existence, we've been led by a procession of faithful pastors. It has been a blessing for me to have been one in that long line of your pastors. Thank you for the privilege! Beginning October 1, Immanuel will be served by an "interim" pastor whose call will be to help bring stability and focus as you do those things necessary to call a new pastor to shepherd Immanuel. Intentionally be part of that process.

The pandemic has done much to challenge the fellowship and sense of unity that was at one time strong here at Immanuel. Reclaim that unity! Realize also that we as a congregation began our own self-imposed "social distancing" a full year before Covid 19 reared its ugly head. We tore down our main social and classroom area in order to build a wonderful, large, new ministry center. The initial idea was that a brief time of change in fellowship and ministry routines was OK because the goal was to have more room for these things. Discord and division happened. Hearts hardened. Distrust divided. The pandemic piles on. With one voice, praise God for the gift of our new space. By the power of the Holy Spirit, join hands and hearts and build for ministry. Don't delay!

Forgiveness and new life are the heart and soul of our Christian faith. Christ died for the forgiveness of sins. It's personal. We're each forgiven so that we can forgive others and share the forgiveness of Christ with them. We pray, "Forgive us our sins as we forgive the sins of others." Matthew, chapter 18 outlines this process between Christian brothers and sisters. In Christ we are called to prayerfully understand the process of forgiveness and apply it to every aspect of our lives.

We are called to be a people of prayer. In this time of transition, be prayerful and intentional as you make your requests known to God, and listen for His direction in your own lives and in the life of Immanuel.

Thank you for our years together in ministry. May the God who began a good work in you all bring it to completion in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

Quarterly Update from Congregation Council President – Sep 2020

For those who attended the semi-annual meeting, thank you for your support. Unfortunately, we did not meet the quorum requirements of 40 voting members and the meeting was closed in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order. We did hold a discussion regarding current church affairs and had some great dialog.

As we try to get back to a normal rhythm of services, we have seven Confirmands completing their Confirmation studies this week. Also, the Council has voted to begin communion during services. The planning for both altar guild and how the communion process will be handled are being worked out. September 6th will be the starting date for communion.

Thanks to the efforts of Eric Fryer and several other folks, the repair to the main church electrical system has begun. New electrical panels and wiring have been installed and the old knob and tube wiring will be replaced very soon. Old unused electrical wire and conduits have been removed and the rear of the church structure repaired and painted. Electrical system changes have been upgraded to make our usage more efficient, thus reducing electrical costs substantially.

As we continue to bring the word of God to Immanuel Lutheran Church, we find ourselves in a challenging time in the life of this congregation. With the upcoming retirement of Pastor Bob Palan we must begin the process to find his replacement. The council has been in contact with Pastor Norm Suliaca, Southwest Mission District Dean, and with his help we have begun the process of finding an “interim” pastor. **Additionally, we are asking interested congregation members to let me or any council member know if you want to be considered for participation on the Call Committee being formed by September 4, 2020.** The Call process can be lengthy and at times challenging, but it’s your opportunity to help us find the next Pastor for Immanuel Lutheran Church.

Also, we are looking for a new Secretary for the office. This position is open to anyone, member of the church or non-member, who is looking for part-time employment (30 hours per week). If you or someone you know is interested in the position, contact the church office for an application and job requirement list.

Finally, I personally want to acknowledge the folks who volunteered their time and talent to plan, those who cooked the meal, those who set up and cleaned up the Chamber, and those that sold those delicious meals during our community festival. Although we were limited with what we could provide, the event was a monumental success for both ILC and the La Vernia community! Well Done Everyone!!

Corona Virus – A Test of our Faith

Everyday challenges can be a test of our faith, no less a global pandemic. Without warning, we experienced a sudden life change with Covid-19. We found ourselves worrying about our health, jobs, schools, childcare, the elderly, and our finances. Businesses shut down, restaurants closed and we were even unable to attend church. This pandemic was not only a threat to our health, but a threat to our trust in God.

While some may complain, hide in fear, and wonder where God is during this pandemic, I wonder if this is an opportunity to awaken people back to God.
