From Pastor Eric's Desk:

The Right Attitude

"Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." Ephesians 4:31-32

I am humbled and grateful, first to the Lord and then to everyone at Immanuel Lutheran Church, La Vernia. Starting on December 1st, 2022, I have been voted in to be the new Pastor of Immanuel. It is time to celebrate and dwell in the innumerable mercies of the Lord over our beautiful Christian community.

Many things have changed for me since I first saw the steeple of the Sanctuary on a beautiful September morning; the pastoral relationship with the parishioners, a better social understanding of our fabulous La Vernia, and getting used to traveling from Kyle to the church. On the other hand, many things have not changed. Since I came on board, I have seen a church with a bright future in Christ. But I have also seen a struggle to understand ourselves and find our voice and identity as Lutherans. This determination is a good sign. It shows that we care and are aware of our responsibilities of thankfulness towards God. I have been convinced since day one (a thing that has not changed) that the process to get us *"unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ"* (Ephesians 4:13) is through proactive actions and words of support and encouragement among each other throughout the right way of thinking the faith (Orthodoxy) towards our unity as a church lead by the wisdom and power of the Holy Spirit.

The Bible has over fifty verses that emphasize to the believers the right attitude, a healthy faith, and high expectations founded on Christ and his power other than in our weaknesses.

As we all recommit to the Lord as part of the beginning of a new time at Immanuel with a new Pastor, my prayers and expectations will be focused on our unity as the body of Christ. In this endeavor, there should be no room for other than the right attitude. Sometimes bad attitudes result from a timid relationship with Christ, the wrong understanding of our mission, a lack of commitment toward others, the wrong priorities, and poor spiritual life.

Correspondence: A donation request from Wounded Warrior Project, TLU scholarship request, North American Lutheran Seminary donation Letter, a thank you letter and donation request from Lutheran Military Veterans and Families Ministries Inc., and a NALC request for Pastor to attend upcoming conference.

Reports: Minutes and treasurer's report were reviewed and accepted; Chrystal emailed the financial report prior to meeting.

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported on 1) Thanksgiving Community Service, 2) All Hallows' Eve bash, 3) NALC Pastor's Retreat, 4) mental health program for youth to begin in January, 5) recent wedding request, 6) new members received, 7) Ushers led by Charles Stork doing great, 8) Veterans' Day representation at Park, 9) next phase of building construction should focus on kitchen, 10) installation date, 11) vacation from 11/24 to 12/3 — services will be led by Darla Buccigrossi and Esther DeHaven will give the sermon on 12/4.
